Spiritual Notes Good Stuff / Bad Stuff

In Hebrews 11:35 there's a shocking transition in the middle of the verse. Faith being a means by which we experience good things in our lives is suddenly shifted to be the means by which we receive bad things into our lives.

Hebrews 11 is a great chapter of faith. Up to v31 the acts in faith of various great individuals such as Abraham, Enoch, Noah and Moses are portrayed. Then in vv32-38 a more general list is given of what happened through faith.

As we look at vv32-38 we are reminded of the statements of Job to his wife. Then his wife said to him, "Do you still hold fast your integrity? Curse God and die." But he said to her, "You speak as one of the foolish women would speak. Shall we receive good from God, and shall we not receive evil?"In all this Job did not sin with his lips (Job 2:9-10). This statement shocks us because we tend to think that God should only give us good things.

There is a problem with our thinking here. We tend towards thinking that we are decent people who deserve good things from God because he should reward our decentness. So when we are happy when we read in vv33-35a about people "Who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received back their dead by resurrection." When we see such statements we tend to nod along and say that is how it should be.

Yet when we receive good things from God we should probe deeper. Yes we rejoice in all the Lord's kind working towards us, but we need to remember what faith is instrumental in doing. The purpose of our Lord in giving us faith, which is our trust in Him, is that we experience the knowledge of Himself as our God. Faith's primary purpose is to know God and not to get from God.

The knowledge of God can come when all is going well, but also when all is going badly. So from vv35b-38 we read of a catalogue of bad things that happened to those who lived by faith. Now if you are a Christian because you expect God to always be giving you good things that you like, then vv35b-38 will give you a rude awakening. The problem though, is not with what He gives you, but rather with what you have been led to expect.

We have to realize that God is not working all things so as we have good things, but rather working all for our good. The ultimate good is that we would be growing in Him and knowing Him. And very often this ultimate good is best worked out through bad things being in our lives.

Our salvation depends upon this being true, because the ultimate man of faith, our Lord Jesus went through incredibly bad things that we might enter into the incredible good of knowing God. The badness of the cross is unfathomable and similarly unfathomable are the blessings that come to us through His cross.

As the world looked at these people of faith they saw them as of no account and happily afflicted and mistreated them (see v37b). But the Lord's view is the

complete reverse. He says that they were those of whom the world was not worthy. Leon Morris writes this "The author appeals to the deep realities not apparent on the surface of things. The despised and ill-treated group of servants of God were of greater value than all the rest of humanity put together." Of course this is not surprising because we follow a Saviour who was despised and rejected by men (ls. 53:3a).

So we must go on by faith and encourage each other to do so. It is the best way; it is God's way. Whether good or bad stuff comes into our lives as a result is not the big issue. Knowing God and being for Him is the big issue.

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
